DIGITAL VIDEO CONFERENCE (GENERATION GLOBAL)
DATE: 16 DECEMBER 2020

A digital video conference under the aegis of Generation Global was organized on 16th December 2020 through the channel ZOOM in which our school participated along with Odessa School n.86, Ukraine. The topic of discussion was '**RIGHTS OF GIRLS AND WOMEN**'.

The VC started at 4.30 pm according to Indian standard time and continued till 6 pm

During the conference the students from both the schools exchanged their views on the status of women in their respective societies.

The Moderator Salsabeel Sarakbi conducted the VC in three rounds.

Students from both the schools started the dialogue by sharing the status of women in their respective communities. Students at Odessa School n.86, Ukraine stated that the government has just passed a law regarding domestic violence in Ukraine as it is a huge problem from which many women in the Ukrainian community are suffering.

The students of Vidya Devi Jindal School explained how women in India also suffer in their communities because of some close-minded people who still believe that girls do not deserve to live, go to school, or even have any rights whatsoever. One of the students of Vidya Devi Jindal School explained how women are subject to discrimination in status and salaries in different areas of social and professional lives.

In the second round, students of both the schools moved to discussion where they agreed that education is extremely important to help girls and women understand their rights and the way they can fight for their rights. They dug deeper in the discussion without the need for the facilitator to intervene. They built a thread through building on each other's' ideas with a space of respect and confidence through their personal experiences.

Through the interaction our students realized that the condition of women in other societies including some European countries, is not much different from that in India and women have to fight a long battle to get equal rights in all spheres of life.
