GENERATION GLOBAL VC REPORT

TOPIC: HUMAN TRAFFICKING

A video conference was organized in the Learning Resource Centre between 11.30 am to 1 pm. on 29th

January 2021 under the aegis of Generation Global. Twelve students from class IX-XI attended the

conference through the channel ZOOM and interacted with students of **Bal Bharti Public School**, **Delhi**.

The conference was moderated by Nonica. The topic of discussion was 'EOD: Human Trafficking'.

VDJS girls highlighted on the fact that how trafficking exists in almost all the countries with various

facts and figures to support. During the dialogue they stated different forms of Human trafficking for

the purpose of forced labour, sexual slavery, commercial sexual exploitation, forced marriage, extraction

of organs or tissues, forced surrogacy etc,. They also highlighted the importance of being human and

how much it is important to understand the rights which is endowed by virtue of being humans. To this

they questioned that people those who are into such horrendous acts of trafficking should they be really

called 'humans'? Students from Bal Bharati Public School shared that being Human is an emotion-to

understand, love and sympathize. Students of VDJS added that the person being trafficked is considered

an object, but human life is unique.

In the second round of dialogue that was enquiry round students from both the schools asked questions

from each other requesting to share and explore their experiences of human trafficking. One of the

students from VDJS said that there is an increase in Human trafficking during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Unemployment, poverty, and illiteracy were cited as main reasons for increase in human trafficking.

The moderator asked the participants to suggest measures to stop Human trafficking. Most of the

participants agreed that social media platforms can be used to spread awareness among the people about

human trafficking. The students also agreed that there is need to work collectively to tackle this issue.

Students asked good follow up questions, spoke to each other in a polite and respectful way throughout

the session.

The VC was wrapped up with two students from each school reflecting their understanding of the issue.

The students expressed their satisfaction that this VC was very informative, and it helped them to learn

more about human trafficking by hearing different perspectives which helped in building a dialogical
