



A civil servant is a government employee. They are appointed by the government to any civil service or post in connection with the affairs of the Central Government.

Unlike regular undergraduate courses, civil service is a lifetime career choice. A Civil servant - on different posts - basically implements the laws and policies that are made by elected leaders, thus, playing a major role in the progress and development of state.

The Civil Services in India are divided into various Groups and Cadres. There are two such groups, namely, Group A and Group B.

- Indian Administrative Service (IAS)
- Indian Foreign Service (IFS)
- Indian Police Service (IPS)

- Indian Audit and Accounts Service- Group 'A'

Part of the charm of doing civil services is the sense of power that people get. While that is the driving force, an inherent feeling of service to the country is most people's motivation to pursue the civil services.

The three topmost services of the Indian Civil Services:

INDIAN ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

lAS is the most popular option among aspirants. It stands for the Indian Administrative Service, a qualification where selected candidates, called lAS officers, are given charge of key and strategic positions in the Union Government, States, and Public-Sector Undertakings. An IAS officer frames policies and advises the ministers on various issues, maintains law and order, supervises the implementation of policies of State Government and Central Government. Apart from this they are also responsible for collecting revenues and function as courts in revenue matters, supervising expenditure of public funds as per norms of financial propriety. The IAS officers also handle the daily affairs of the government, including framing and implementation of policy in consultation with the minister responsible for the department concerned.

INDIAN POLICE SERVICES

IPS stands for the Indian Police Service, where selected officers are trained as senior officers in the police force and other security or law enforcement agencies in India. The Indian Police Service or IPS is primarily a qualification which trains officers in the maintenance of Law and Order. This is the premier uniformed civil service in the country. IPS officers work for both the Central and State governments. They serve the State government in various capacities ranging from Assistant Superintendent of Police at the beginning of their careers to the Director-General of Police (who is the head of the police force in his state) later in their careers. The officers and the position come under the Ministry of Home Affairs. They are responsible for maintaining public peace and order, VIP security, railway policing, anti-smuggling and drug trafficking, tackling economic offences, corruption in public life, disaster management etc. Some of the other agencies that higher level IPS officers serve in are the CBI, IB, Central Armed Police Forces etc. With changing times however, more and more IPS officers are serving in departments and areas that used to exclusively be the forte of IAS officers, just as the IAS officers now at times head departments such as vigilance which were exclusively given to IPS Officers. This widening of opportunities and exposure has made the IPS exam more attractive.

INDIAN FOREIGN SERVICES

IFS stands for the Indian Foreign Service, a qualification where selected candidates are trained to handle foreign relations and get to work in Indian embassies or related offices. This is quite an exciting prospect for most people but is also a tough nut to crack. IFS officers basically represent the country in the international arena, dealing with the country's external affairs, diplomacy, trade and cultural relations. It is responsible for the administration and activities of Indian missions abroad, and for the framing and implementation of the government's foreign policy.

How to Pursue a Career in Civil Services

Civil services require graduate degree before one goes and writes the UPSC examination. Graduation can be personal discipline from anywhere in the country. Selected candidates are given different posts according to the position they get in UPSC.

Important Facts

For most services, graduation with a minimum age of 21 is the eligibility criteria. Except IAS and IPS- subject of Bhutan, Nepal and Tibet refugees can apply.

HOW TO JOIN

To join the civil services, one needs to appear for the Civil Services Examination and secure a top rank in order to get selected. Every year, around 3.5 to 4 lakh students take the Civil Services Aptitude Test (CSAT/ Preliminary) examination conducted by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) for the 400 to 500 vacancies. The entry into the State-level Civil Services is through a competitive examination conducted by the respective State Public Service Commission. Most of the states conduct their own service commission exams; some popular ones are Rajasthan Public Service Commission (RPSC), Uttar Pradesh Public Service Commission (MPPSC).

The civil services examination is conducted by the Union Public Service Commission every year. These exams are very tough, are not easy to crack and highly competitive. Sheer hard work and determination is required to be successful in these competitive examinations.

The civil services examination consists of a three-stage selection process:

Preliminary Examination, Main Examination, and Interview

Prelims exam consists Paper -1 & Paper 2 (MCQ), General Knowledge,

Vocabulary, Social Studies, Science (6th -12th class), Indian polity & constitution, logical reasoning, mathematical aptitude.

Main Examination has 8 papers: Indian Language, English, Essay, General Studies (4 papers) and Optional paper.

Interview/ Personality Test

Skills Required: It is important to have the right set of skills to be able to shoulder the responsibilities that come. Here are the major skill sets that the aspirants must have to be successful at what they do:

- 1. First thing that will surely be tested is the student's IQ.
- 2. Memorizing power is the second criterion.
- 3. Presence of mind. How quickly one can draw the inference.
- 4. Logical reasoning power.
- 5. How will the candidate function under stress of time and big number of interdependent parameters.
- 6. Power of analysis and synthesis. Most important!
- 7. Candidate's confidence level and decision-making ability
- 8. Candidate's diligence, responsiveness, and resilience
- 9. Commitment for Work, integrity and sense of justice
- 10. Rationality of thought and action.

PROS & CONS

One cannot lay enough emphasis on the kind of popularity of Civil Services as a career option among students in India. No doubt this career does offer its successful aspirants with a significant amount of power; however, one must also understand that with that kind of incoming power the path to becoming a civil services officer is strewn with immense hard work and sheer dedication. Salaries may not be as high as compared to other professions. Inter-job transfers may be difficult and sometimes inevitable, so it is like a double-edged sword. Job-hopping is not an option as once you choose a branch of civil services you have to pretty much stick to it.
