3. 'Happiness' & 'Habit Formation' by TFC

An orientation seminar on 'Happiness' & 'Habit Formation' was conducted by Talks For Change(TFC), a counseling platform. TFC offers customised workshops for students and staff by trained and industry experts to guide and train people with real-life experiences. The keynote speakers, Dr Gagandeep, Mr Raghav, Mr Geetanshu, and Mr Rishabh dwelt on topics like 'The Power of Habits', Importance of Habits and 'Habit Development program for Happiness' to enhance the human potential for a better personal and professional life. The session ended on a positive note, wherein the teachers were enlightened about how human beings are the result
