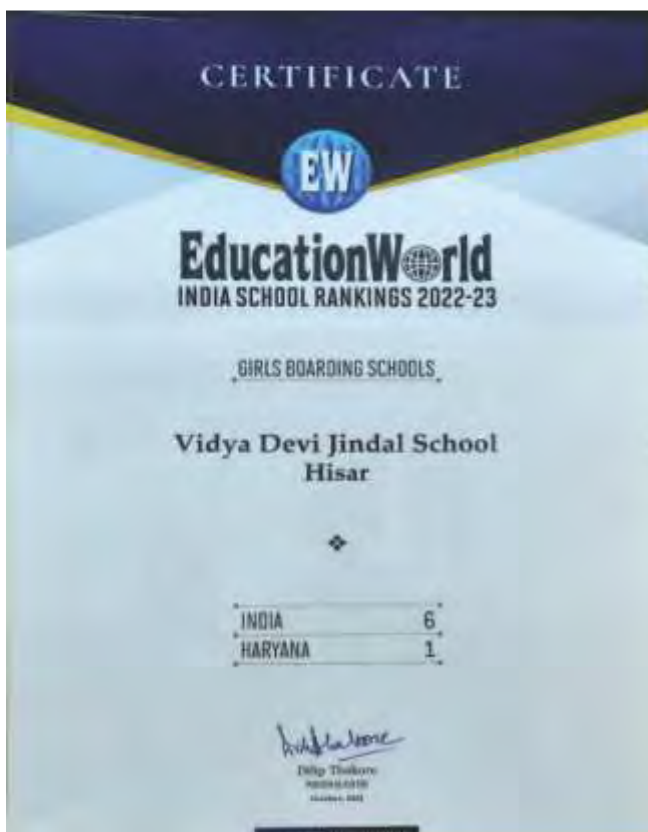

जयपुर संवाददाता, हिंसार: नीट परीक्षा के लिए नेशनल टेस्ट एजेंसी (एनटीई) की ओर से हिंसार जिले में भी करीब 13 सेंटर बनाए गए। रविवार को सभी परीक्षा केंद्रों पर नीट की परीक्षा हुई। परीक्षा का समय 2 बजे से 5 बजे तक था। देढ़ बजे परीक्षा के लिए सेंटरों पर एंटी शुरू थी। इसके बाद कुछ परीक्षार्थी परीक्षा देने पहुंचे तो वे, पर एंटी नहीं मिली। काफी सतर्क के बाद हिंसार में नीट परीक्षा का सेंटर बना था। हिंसार में सेंटर पाकर परीक्षार्थी और अभिभावक दोनों काफी खुश दिखे। इस बार एनटीईएस, चोहरासरा व अन्य के लिए एक ही पैपर हुआ। अब गैरिंट के अक्षर पर चयन होगा। जब विद्यार्थियों से बातचीत की गई तो ज्ञेने कि पैपर में रिजिक्स, कैमरेट्री के प्रश्न काफी कठिन थे और बांधे अमान थी। पैपर अनजाने टाइम था। पहले पैपर अनजाने होता था। परीक्षा केर से जागरू निकले तो अपने माता-पिता से बोले कि रिजिक्स के प्रश्न सभी टर्क थे, अन्य देवी परिष्णम के वैवे रं। सभी सेंटर पर फुलस तेनात रही।

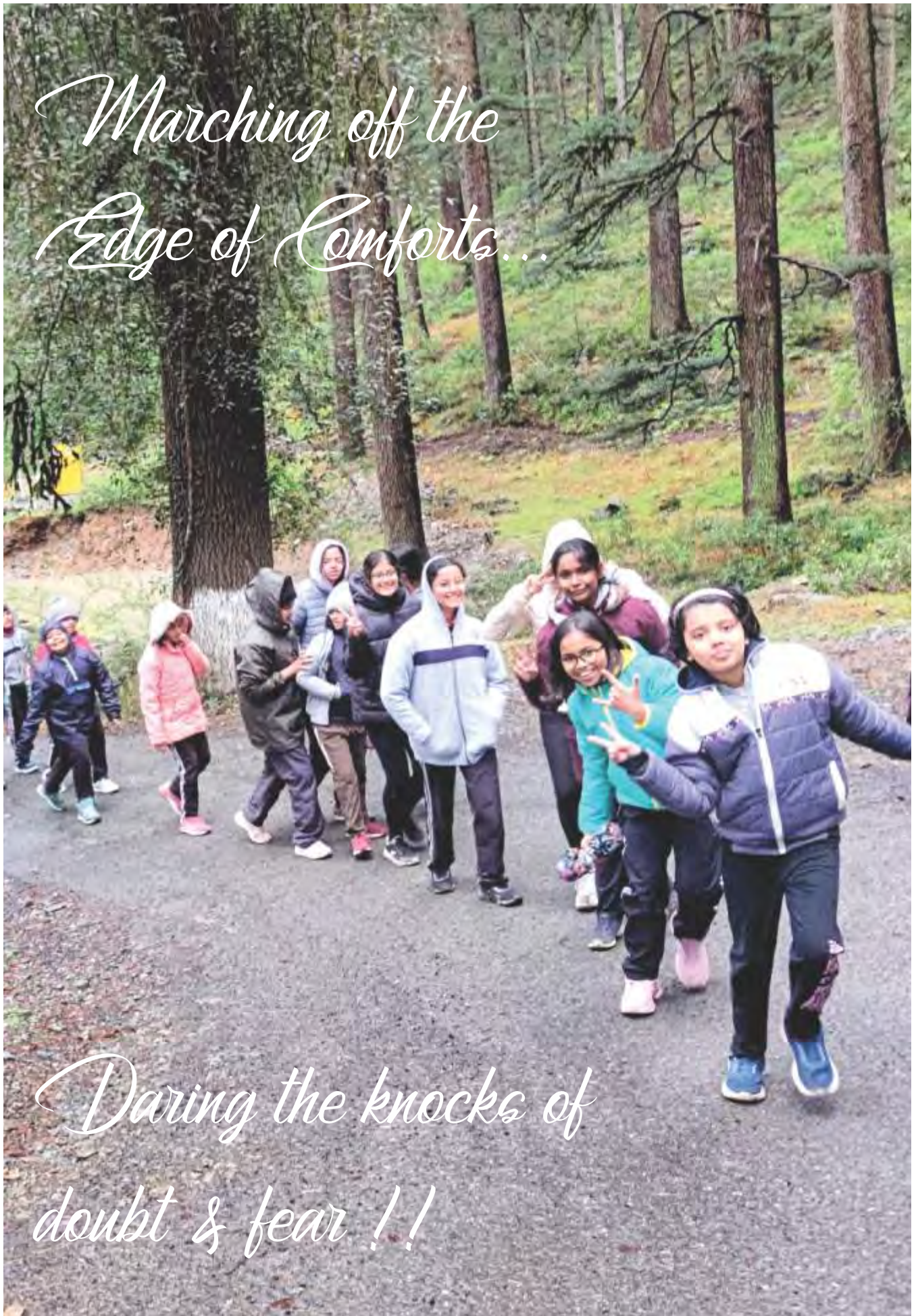

Alternative Practices

The 'Alternative Practices' integrated by staff and students were a multi-disciplinary approach towards the curriculum. Inviting colleagues as subject experts, audio-visual learning, role play, brochure making, research-based learning, video making, podcasts, art integration, flip classrooms, peer tutoring, and usage of AI tools such as Kahoot! Quiz, Immersive Reader, Inkle writer, Semantris- all these practices were incorporated into the education programme to ensure the inclusivity of all kinds of learners in their treasure hunt for knowledge and wisdom.

Mindspark

Students of Classes IV to X were reintroduced to Mindspark, a personalised learning software to enable them to effectively advance at their own pace, cover up their learning gaps and engage in studies with a newfound interest. The Mindspark sessions of Maths, Science, and English have been especially fruitful with the junior classes - appealing to the young, curious and restless minds of the little ones. This programme acts as an assistant teacher for all students, helping them with topics they have difficulty understanding. The questions start from the grass root level and go on to the high-order level. Getting rewarded with sparkies that they receive for answering the questions correctly are the tiny joys the girls look forward to.

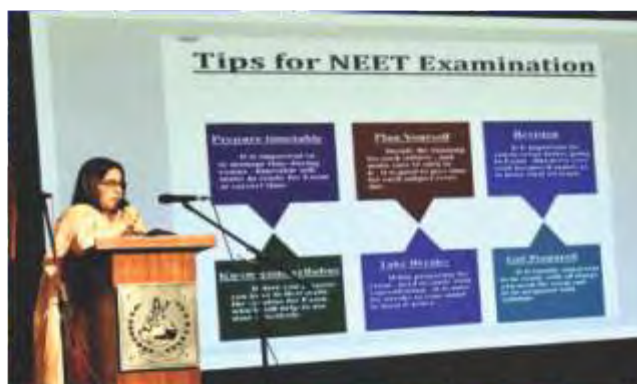


Action Research

As the story goes, Roberto Nevelis of Venice, Italy, is often credited with having invented homework to punish students who didn't demonstrate a good understanding of the lessons taught during class. At VDJS, under 'Action Research', it has become a way to realise one's potential and build up the confidence of, 'Yes! I can do it!!' The quality of differentiated instructional assignments was reviewed. It was effectively implemented across the classes. Students gave their valuable feedback after completion of each assignment on the four parameters: timely completion, difficulty level, most interesting or challenging section and learning outcome. Extra Academic Hours to cater to special assignments benefitted forty-two students in their learning journey of Mathematics, Science, and Social Science.

Parent Connect

To make parents active partners in the educational journey of children, the school collaborated with parents under the actionable 'Parent Connect' wherein parents from different professions such as Law, Chartered Accountancy, Medical and Armed Forces were invited to share their professional journey and guide aspiring students for the same.

Faculty Development Programme

Learning doesn't discriminate, it welcomes all, the teacher and the taught, the expert and the naïve. VDJS' progressive staff is on its lifelong pilgrimage of new learnings to deliver the best. Hence, various Faculty Development Programmes were conducted throughout the academic session to enhance the communication and IT Skills of the teachers. The school collaborated with 'Connect 2 Learn' to empower teachers to deliver quality 21st-Century education and cater to the needs of digital natives. The five monthly modules strengthened the skills of staff on Competency-Based Learning and Assessment, Foundations of Hybrid Learning Cultures, Strengthening Educator Student Relationships to Build Engagement, Hybrid Learning Curriculum and Content, Using Technology for Effective Learning and Assessment, Pedagogies for Digital Natives, Preparing Students for Active Learning, Learner Centric Learning Experiences, Essentials of Mentoring Skills and Designing Accurate MCQ Based Assessments.

Stakeholder surveys were conducted quarterly to assess satisfaction levels among students and staff members. The survey questions focused on elements of learning such as academic programming, support services, level of challenge and pacing, relevant assignments, learning goals and feedback, teacher expectations and curricular consistency.

The set goals and aspirations were accomplished as the staff enthusiastically executed the Annual Pedagogical Plan with quarterly review throughout the session. The implementation of alternative innovative practices fostered students' curiosity and their ownership towards learning and competing with themselves.
