
## **Round Square-Inspiring Voices-the Big Baraza**


## **April 12-19**




After the registrations at Queen's College, there was a mask making activity in which we have created the masks matching with our ball room dresses of the evening.

After the opening ceremony All delegation was

divided into 18 different Baraza groups named after the great people of the world. Palak was in *Gandhi* Group, Prachi and the Teacher Seema Dhillon were in *Wilde* Group, Nainika was in *Eliot* Group and Karshna was one of the leaders in *Atkinson* Group. All groups lead by their Baraza Leaders and accompanied by the teachers in their groups, went on a scavenger hunt in which they were given some clues to reach on particular points of the Oxford city through various interior bumpy roads. Through this activity students explored the city in a fun way and earned chocolates and cookies for solving the puzzle.

On 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> April, before Lunch all the baraza discussion and preparation of the debates took place in the colleges itself where the teams were staying, in supervision of the teachers. In the

afternoon, the debate sessions were conducted, three each day in the Oxford Union in a very organized manner. The participants asked various challenging questions from the opposition and propositions. Our students Nainika Aneja spoke for the proposition on the topic 'Social media is a threat to the integrity of democratic elections due to the proliferation of misinformation" and Palak Beniwal spoke for the proposition on the topic 'Vaccinations should be mandatory to stop the spread and threat of disease and to prevent the onset of a global epidemic or pandemic'.

On 14<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> April Keynote speakers also delivered their speeches in St Annes college on Environment and Democracy.









On 15<sup>th</sup> evening a Punting activity was organised in local water stream for the delegates. Which we enjoyed a lot.


