ANNUAL DAY CELEBRATION



Science Exhibition

The exhibits ranged from sustainable solutions like chalk production using Plaster of Paris statue residue to intricate representations of biological processes such as Drip Irrigation, a model of the Heart, and demonstrations of Artificial Womb, working models of Contraction and Relaxation of muscles, Atomic Structure, Periodic Table, Water Cycle, DNA, Aeroponics, Household Circuits, Series and Parallel Connections, Water Pump, Microscope, Models related to Newton's Law of Motion, Simple Machines and the Concept of Light. The students not only showcased their talents but also inspired curiosity and awareness among their peers and visitors.

This initiative, held from August 13th to 20th, 2023, was inaugurated by Mr Tsering Namgyal, the esteemed Lower Leh Councillor, highlighting community support. The project epitomised the spirit of service and holistic growth for students from four prestigious schools: The Doon School, Dehradun; All Saints College, Nainital; Vivek High School, Chandigarh, and Vidya Devi Jindal School, Hisar.

A total of 23 students and 7 teachers embarked on this transformative journey, aiming not only to make a difference but also to cultivate invaluable life lessons and experiences. Media coverage by News 18, Ladakh, further amplified the VDJS Ladakh Service Project's reach, celebrating the commitment to education and service in the region.





Building Bridges through Service

The first, Jamyang School in central Leh, serves as a cornerstone of education for 320 students, with 200 residing in its boarding facilities. Here, the student team undertook the construction of essential washroom facilities, enhancing the quality of life for residential students and supporting their educational environment.

The second school, Shachukul Middle School, nestled in Tangtse village, provides education from Classes I-VII in a challenging landscape marked by harsh climatic conditions. Recognizing the critical need for sustainable resources, the RS Team donated a year's salary for a teacher and installed solar panels, empowering the school with renewable energy solutions.

Cultural Immersion and Exploration

Beyond their service commitments, the participants delved into Ladakh's rich cultural tapestry and natural wonders. Excursions included visits to the Karu Army Exhibition, the breathtaking Changla Pass (one of the world's highest motorable passes), the serene Thiksey Monastery, Rancho School, and the historic Rezang La Pass, a poignant reminder of India's resilience during the Indo-China War of 1962. The visit to Pangong So, famed for its role in the iconic movie "3 Idiots," added a touch of cinematic charm to the journey.




THE INTERNATIONAL AWARD FOR YOUNG PEOPLE (IAYP)


















REPUBLIC DAY















JOURNEY
