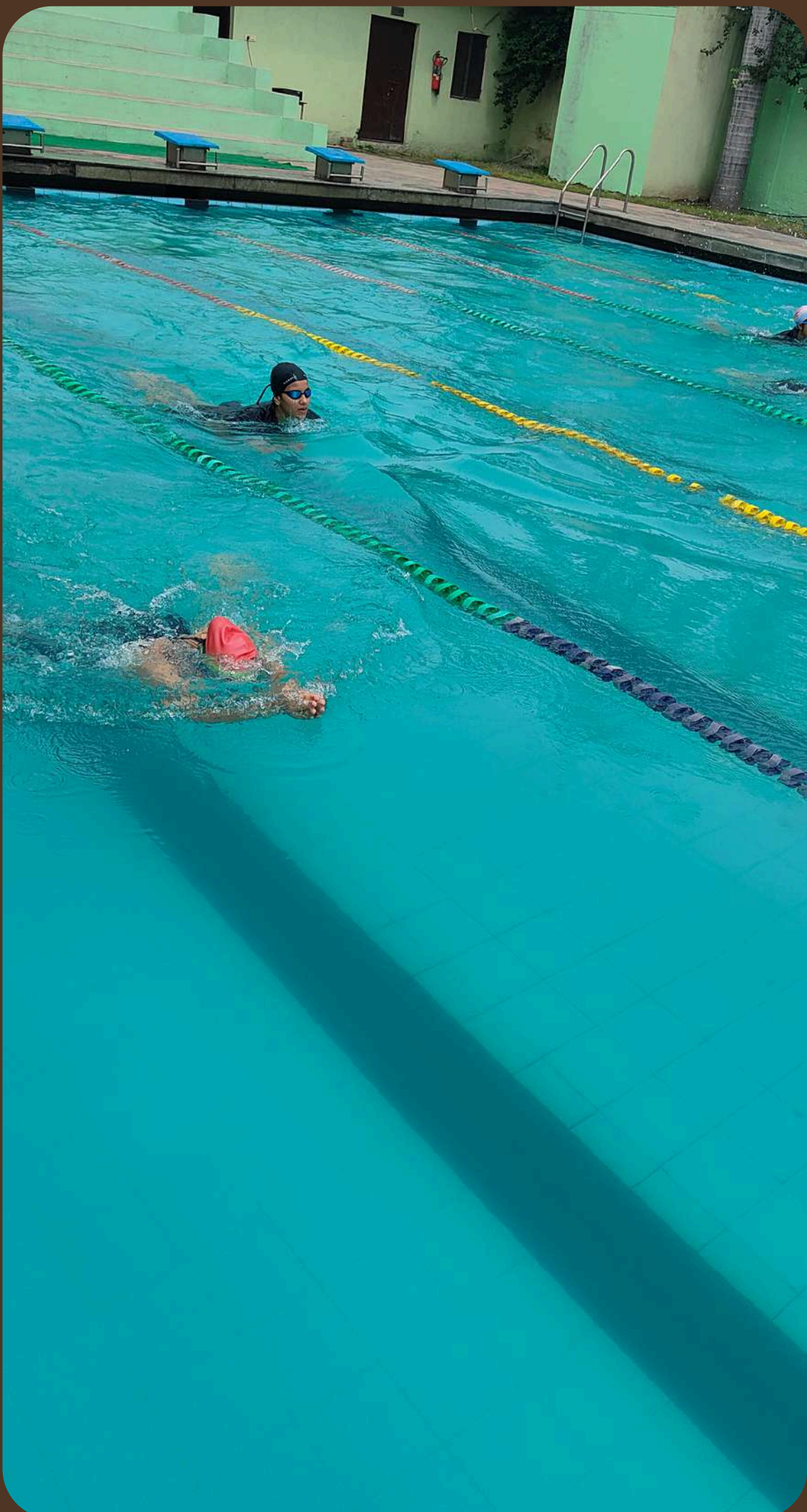
Soccer CBSE Under-14
