Student Code of Conduct

Basic Etiquettes/ Courtesies

- Maintaining courteous behavior, including greeting all staff and visitors and showing respect in interactions, is integral to a quality education. Students are expected to uphold the school's reputation and ethos through their conduct.
- Within the classroom, students are expected to uphold decorum and discipline to maintain an effective learning environment.

Attendance:

- Attendance is mandatory for all academic lessons, activities, assemblies, and scheduled games as outlined in the timetable. Students are required to attend all school events unless they have received an exemption from the school authorities.
- No student may leave the campus without prior permission from the Administrator or Principal.
- Students are not allowed to leave the boarding houses after dinner without permission from their Housemistress / Dorm Parent.
- Students must strictly adhere to the school's 'Leave' policy, allowing leave requests only for emergencies or medical issues during the term. Approval, limited to three days, will be granted by the Principal based on DSW / RMO's recommendations. Leave may be sanctioned for emergencies like death or critical illness within the immediate family.
- Students must return on time after vacation or leave. In the event of medical reasons, parents/guardians must notify the school and submit supporting medical documentation to the Resident Medical Officer (RMO) upon the student's return.
- Medical leave will only be sanctioned by the Principal upon the RMO's recommendation. Upon return, students must submit all medical documents and prescriptions to the RMO.
- Leave granted for celebrations or family functions will be limited to three days, excluding travel time. For marriage events, an invitation card must be provided.

This type of leave will be approved once annually, limited to the marriages of siblings and first cousins.

- Leave for college-related entrance tests may be granted to students with the Principal's approval, based on recommendations from the Career Department and submission of relevant documents such as registration or admit cards.
- Students are not allowed to leave shortly before the end or beginning of the academic term.
- Attendance is of utmost importance, and any absence without prior permission will be considered a violation of school policy.

Leaving School after Board Examinations:

- Grade XII students must depart from the campus accompanied by their parents immediately after their last board examination paper.

Travel and Departure Policies:

- Students may exit campus with their parents. If they are being accompanied by guardians, parents must email guardian details to the HM, and guardians must carry a valid ID along with an authorization letter from the parents. Under no circumstances will students be permitted to leave campus with an unauthorized individual.
- If a parent fails to arrive on time to collect their ward at the beginning of vacation on the scheduled date, then the student will be held at the school until the parent arrives.
- In cases where parents are unable to pick up or drop off their students at the beginning or end of vacation, the school will, upon request from the parents, make arrangements for the students' travel with an escort teacher.
- Students must adhere to the specified timeframe for returning to school after vacations.
- Parents are not allowed to remain on school grounds beyond the designated timeframe.
- Parents/ guardians are restricted from entering the Boarding Houses.

Phone Call

- Students will be allotted 120 minutes of calling per month. They may use the phone booths provided in the boarding houses. Calling facilities will be available from 2:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on weekdays and from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Sundays. Each student will be permitted Two(2) phone calls a week (15 minute each) on pre-alloted days.
- International students can make WhatsApp calls to their parents through the Resident House Mistress's official phone. They will be allowed to make calls twice a week, each lasting for 20 minutes.
- Parents may call the Mentor/House Mistresses at a mutually convenient time. However, the use of email is the preferred method of communication with the school.

Personal Hygiene

- Students must bathe daily.
- Girls are allowed to use only black bands to tie their hair. Girls with shoulder-length hair are required to secure it with a ponytail, while those with longer hair must braid it.
- Nails must be kept short, clean, and regularly trimmed.
- Hair colouring, dyeing, or bleaching is not permitted, nor is the use of henna on the hair or body.
- Multiple piercings on the ears are not allowed. Only single small ear studs are permitted
- Tattoos are not allowed on any part of the body.
- No makeup or nail polish is permitted.

Clothing and School Uniform

- Students are required to wear neat and clean school uniform at all times while in school, during journeys to and from school, at the beginning and end of each term, during outings, and when representing the school in various forums.
- During academic hours, students must adhere to the following uniform guidelines according to the seasons:

- Summer Uniform: White shirt, checked skirt, black shoes, white socks, and school belt.
- Winter Uniform: White shirt, grey woollen trousers, school blazer, school tie, school belt, grey scarf, black shoes, and grey socks.
- Saturdays: White shirt, house skirt, white socks, and sports shoes.
- Sundays: House Uniform
- Evening Attire: White Kurta Pyjama (Summer) and Tracksuit (Winter).
- Traveling Attire: Black jeans, House T-shirt.
- Birthday: School-appropriate colored dresses can be worn during birthdays (IV-VIII).
- After academic hours, students are expected to follow the dress code specified in circulars released from time to time.
- No student is permitted to wear 'floaters' with the school uniform unless authorized by the Resident Medical Officer (RMO) for medical reasons. Fancy footwear is prohibited.

Dining Hall

- Proper decorum must be maintained during meal times in the Dining Hall.
- Attendance at all meals is compulsory.
- No student is allowed to fast during meal times for any reason unless permitted by the RMO for medical purposes.
- There are no special seating arrangements according to diet or social background, and students are expected to be seated as assigned by the DSW.
- No student is allowed to request any special meal to be served in the Dining Hall.
- Students and staff must consume the meals provided by the school in the Dining Hall.
- There should be no wastage of food. Students are expected to finish all the food they serve themselves.
- No food should be carried outside the dining hall by any student.

- Students are not allowed to take any cutlery, serving dishes, or any other utensil/equipment out of the Dining Hall.
- Decorum must be observed when grace is said before and after meals.
- Students should greet visitors entering the Dining Hall, be polite, and observe table manners.

Cafeteria

- A cafeteria facility is provided on campus. No student is allowed to visit the café on non-designated days.
- All purchases in the café must be made using coupons; cash/credit/debit cards are not permitted.
- Students are permitted to celebrate their birthdays in the cafeteria with their classmates, but only under the supervision of their Class Teacher and Parallel Class Teacher.
- The café must be kept neat and clean by all users.

Hostel Night Prep, Movement, and Lights Out

- Prep time must be strictly adhered to as per the Daily Schedule.
- Prep time is allocated for students to engage in self-study and must be observed in absolute silence.
- After dinner, students are not permitted to leave the House except in special circumstances or emergencies, with the permission of House Staff.
- The designated "Lights Out" timings must be strictly adhered to. Senior students may be granted additional study time in their rooms at the discretion of the Housemistress. However, students are required to switch off the study unit light and rest after the extended permissible time.

Boarding House

- Every room within the Boarding House must be kept neat and clean at all times.
- Beds must be neatly made and covered with the counterpane when not in use, except during sleeping hours and afternoon rest time as per the schedule.
- No student is allowed to bolt or lock her room at any time of the day or night.

Visiting Another House/Room

- No student is allowed to enter another Boarding House without the permission of the Dorm Parent/Resident Housemistress.
- Senior students are not permitted to enter junior students' rooms, and vice versa.

Wellness Centre and Medicines

- The Wellness Centre's Outpatient Department (OPD) timings must be strictly adhered to.
- Students are not permitted to keep any medicine in their room or cupboard. Only the Dorm Parent may administer medicines prescribed by the School's RMO.
- In case of a medical emergency, the RMO should be contacted immediately.
- Students who wear glasses or contact lenses should provide the Resident Medical Officer (RMO) with a copy of the ophthalmologist's prescription.
- Parents must inform the RMO of any serious medical conditions such as recent surgery, allergies, asthma, or other important medical information.
- The school refers students to doctors from its panel of specialists. Parents wishing to refer their child to another doctor must make a written request.
- Every student visiting the Wellness Centre should carry the House Medical Register with her, or during classes, a referral slip signed by the DOAC/DSW/Academic Coordinators.
- If a student needs to visit the Wellness Centre after dinner, she must be accompanied by the Dorm Parent or Sahayika.

Sports

- All students are expected to participate in sports as scheduled by the school. However, if a student is medically unfit, permission must be obtained from the COS based on the recommendation of the RMO (with supporting medical documents).
- Specific playing fields are designated for particular sports.
- Before participating in a match after being medically excused, students must seek permission from the RMO.
- The school maintains a strict stance against dangerous play or unsporting behaviour.
- No staff member, student, or guest is permitted to swim alone in the pool. Swimming is permitted only under the supervision of an official lifeguard or swimming coach.
- Sports equipment should be stored in the Sports Department and not in the Boarding Houses.
- The school gym is off-limits to students in the absence of the Gym Instructor.

Prohibited items

- Students are prohibited from keeping matchboxes, lighters, candles, incense sticks, firearms, crackers, knives, weapons, or any other potentially dangerous items.
- Cash, tuck, or valuables are not permitted in the boarding houses. The school will not take responsibility for any valuables if lost. Surplus travel funds must be given to the Housemistress at the start of the term and will be returned to parents at the term's end.
- Students are not allowed to operate credit accounts with anyone or possess/use credit/debit cards.
- Expensive personal belongings are not allowed.

Electronic gadgets and electrical appliances

- Students are allowed to have specific electronic devices approved by the school, like Kindles, MP3 players, cameras, and laptops, with configurations specified by the school. They must hand over these gadgets to their Housemistress/Dorm Parent and can only use them during leisure time in the boarding houses.

- Mobile phones are strictly forbidden, and if any student is found with one, it will be considered a serious violation of the school rules.
- Students are prohibited from keeping or using any electric gadgets like electric kettles, room heaters, irons, cooking appliances, hair dryers, or any other electrical devices.
- The internet service is designated for educational purposes and constructive communication limited to parents or universities approved by the Careers Department.
- Students may carry mobile phones while travelling alone from home to the school, the same shall be deposited with the Resident House Mistress and will be returned to the student for the journey home.

Firefighting equipment

- Students must not tamper with fire-fighting equipment.

Jewellery

- Students are permitted to wear only wristwatches, simple ear-studs, and a nose pin as jewellery. Smart watches are not permitted.
- Gold chains are not permitted; however, if a gemstone is worn for religious reasons, it should be threaded to a strong black thread and worn under the uniform.
- Fancy earrings, nose-rings, finger-rings, or bangles are not allowed.
- Students are allowed to wear thin 'karas' for religious purposes.

Boarding House

- The school maintains the prerogative to conduct searches of student rooms, lockers, study units, cupboards, clothing, bedding, boxes, or any other personal spaces.
- Students must ensure that their study units, lockers, and other occupied spaces are emptied by the final day of each term. The school bears no responsibility for any items left behind.

- Students are prohibited from locking any allocated space. Should a study unit, cupboard, locker, or room be found locked, it will be forcibly opened.

Out of Bound Areas

- School laboratories, IT labs, department rooms, and Offices including the Staff room are off-limits without adult supervision.
- Access to rooftops of all school buildings is strictly prohibited.
- Entry into water tanks is strictly forbidden.
- The swimming pool is accessible only during designated swimming hours, in the presence of a lifeguard.
- Staff Quarters are out of bounds.

Boarding House Luggage Room

- Access to the house luggage room is strictly restricted unless prior permission is granted by the Housemistress/Dorm Parent. Students must be accompanied by a Dorm Parent when accessing the luggage room.
- Suitcases, bags, or boxes are not permitted inside the dormitories. All baggage should be stored in the designated store room. Everyday items must be kept in the provided study unit/cupboard space allocated to each student.

Vehicles

- Students are strictly forbidden from driving on the school campus.

Consequences

- The school fosters a culture of discipline and effective learning in its daily operations. It is expected that every student follows the code of conduct in both principle and practice.

- School Prefects are tasked with keeping a record of students who fail to adhere to the school's rules and regulations in their discipline diary, forwarding these names to the DSW for appropriate action.
- Students failing to complete assignments on time or displaying a casual attitude towards studies despite reminders and counseling by the teacher will receive Sunday detention. Persistent disinterest and lack of effort will prompt DOAC/ Academic Co coordinators to contact parents either in writing or through phone call.

Green Card

The issuance of a Green Card by The DOAC signifies a student's failure to achieve passing marks in any term examination. Following this, DOAC will send a letter to parents outlining the remedial measures implemented to enhance the student's academic performance.

White Slip

White Slips are issued by the DSW, DOAC, Academic Co-coordinators, or TOD upon referral by any staff member for the following acts of indiscipline:

- Disruptive behaviour with peers or adults.
- Causing disturbances during school activities, hindering teaching and learning.
- Reporting late to school.
- Skipping mandatory school activities.
- Violation of dress code and grooming guidelines.
- Breaching cafeteria rules.
- Unauthorised use of school communication systems.
- Violating the school's IT policy.
- Being found in restricted areas.

The DSW will maintain records of White Slips. Issuing authorities will submit daily reports of White Slips to the DSW office. Accumulation of three White Slips will result in the issuance of a Yellow Card.

Yellow Card

The issuance of a Yellow Card by the Principal, upon recommendation by the DSW, entails formal written communication to the parents. Yellow Cards are issued for the following breaches of discipline:









- Possession of prohibited electronic items, such as mobile phones.
- Theft
- Possession of stolen property
- Extortion (attempting to obtain something of value from another through force or intimidation)
- Engaging in fights resulting in visible injuries
- Vandalism causing damage to school property
- Possession or attempted smuggling of unauthorized tuck items into school premises.

Red card

The issuance of a Red Card by the Principal follows a Discipline Committee Meeting and results in suspension from the School, as recommended by the Committee, for the following infractions:

- Defiance and violation of the Student Code of Conduct within or outside the school premises while representing the institution.
- Disrespect towards adults.
- Possession or consumption of prohibited items such as cigarettes, tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or any other intoxicating substances.
- The school has a zero-tolerance policy towards substance policy.
- The school has zero tolerance policy towards bullying/ harassment.
- Accumulating two Red Cards within one term will result in strict disciplinary action as and when decided by the Discipline committee.

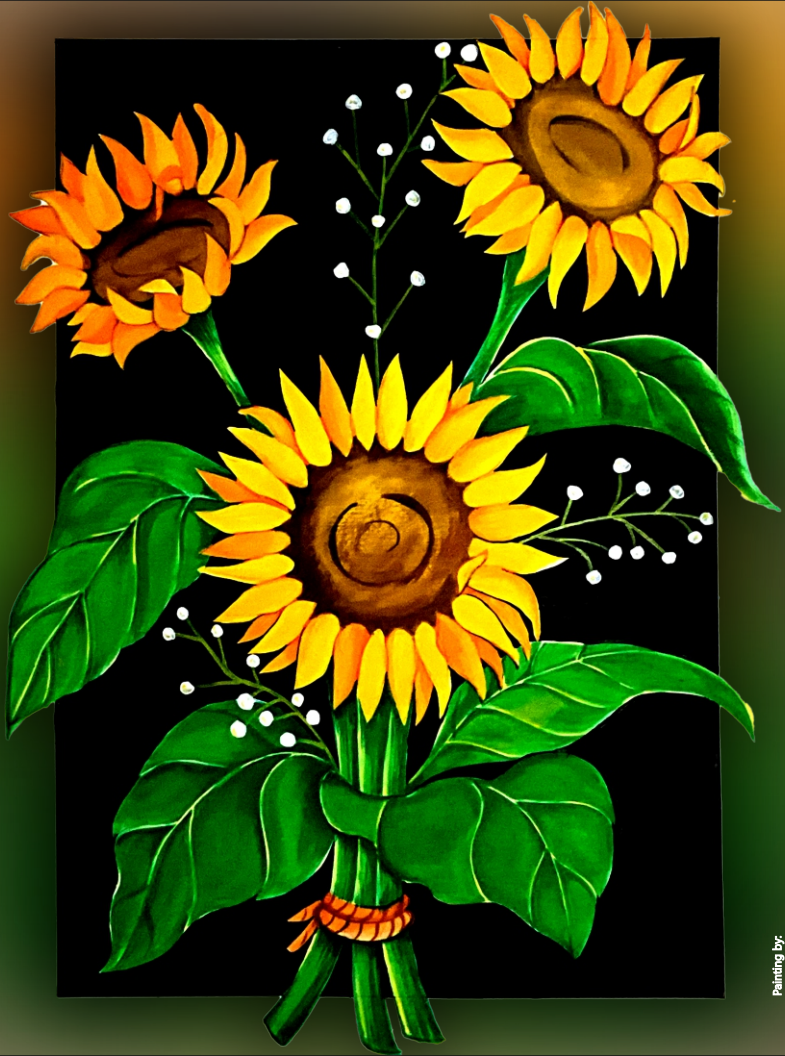
